Wildlife Water Trail

A water-borne mystery trail by electric boat, along dykes fringed with marshland plants. An experienced guide will show you the wildlife. Stunning dragonflies, marsh harriers, wild flowers and swallowtail butterflies can all be seen here at different times of the year. The trip lasts 50 minutes including a short walk to a bird hide, and departs from How Hill Staithe. Booking is advisable, as the boat takes a maximum of six people.

April, May and October at weekends, bank holidays, Easter week and local half-term 11am-3pm

June-September daily 10am-5pm

Adults £7, Children and concessions £6,

- A sound amplification system is available - please ask for details when booking.
- In summer/autumn you might find insect repellent helpful for both trails.
- Visitors with disabilities may find it helpful to telephone in advance to check whether How Hill is sufficiently accessible for you. There is a mooring reserved for easy access day boats and a 300 m easy access path.
- Sorry - dogs (except guide dogs) are not allowed on the walking or water trails.
